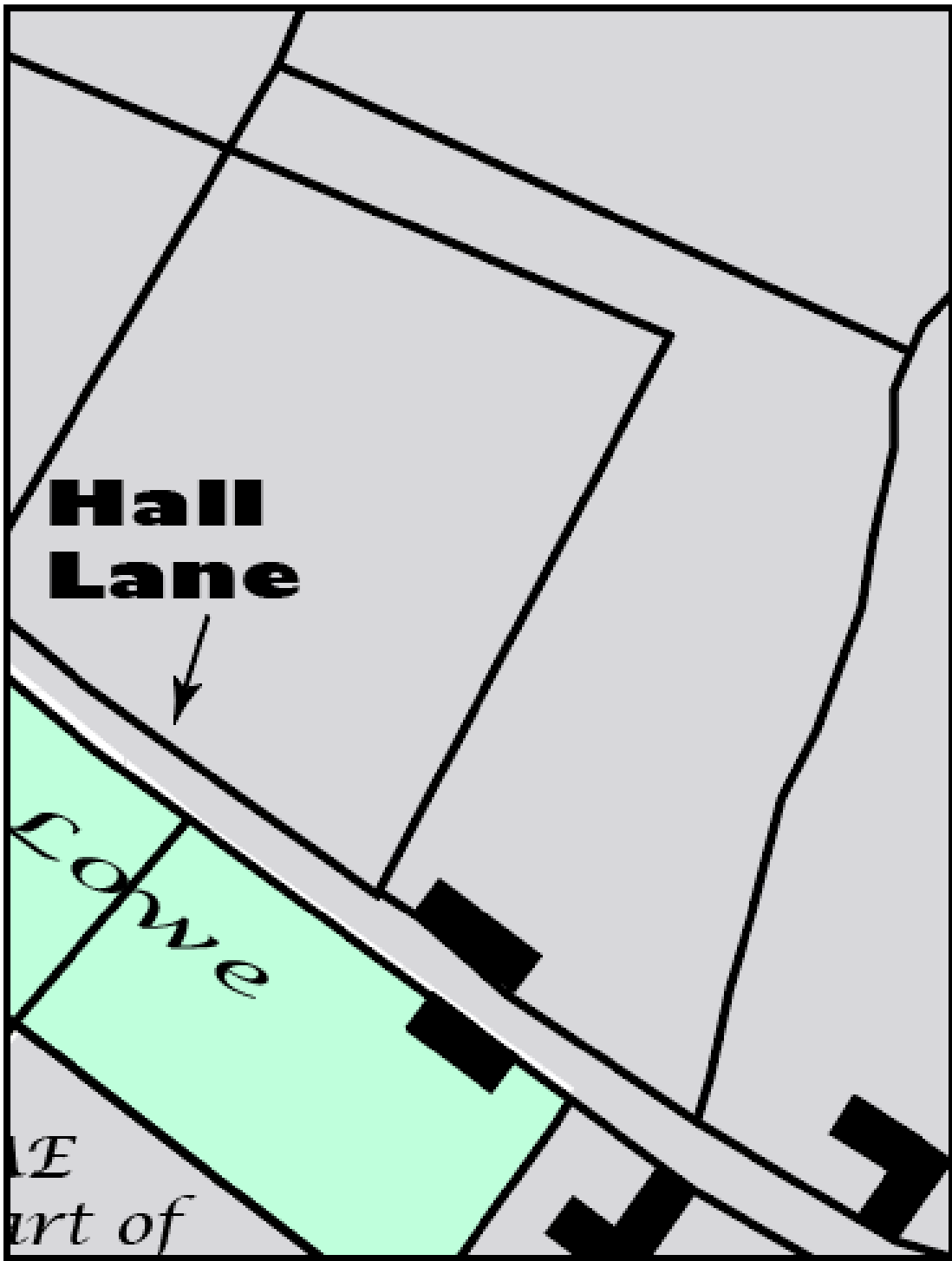


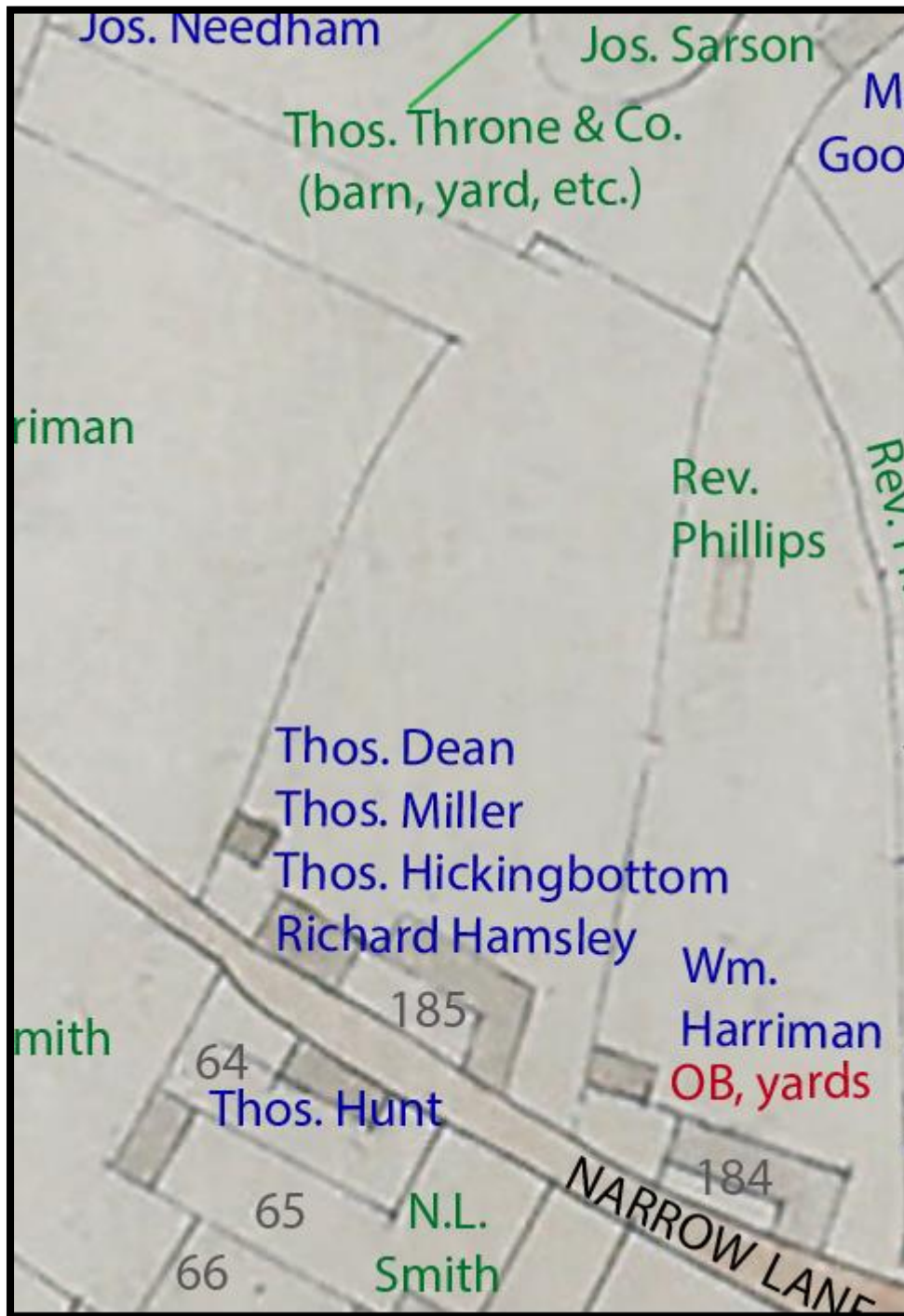
Hollytree cottage

1778 enclosure plan



Single rectangular building on Hall Lane (that became Narrow lane). Bordering Manor House. Owner/occupant unknown.

1824 Plot 185



4 'houses and gardens' on plot 185.

Thus, total area 1 rood and 18 perches( 0.36 acres). Plot shares boundary with Manor House.

Thos. Dean born 1787 also owns another small plot of land at the bottom of Shepshed Road that was to become Fuller's factory). In 1830 poll Thos. Dean is a "higgler" i.e a peddlar.

Father of Thos. Dean is Edward Dean a major land holder and farmer and also a owner of several properties up Wide Lane. He lived in house on plot 90 later site of school and Gladstone Street.

Separated from Manor House by Victoria Terrace. Houses to west up Narrow Lane as far as but not including 'The Firs'.

**A walk round Hathern No. 45.** Grade II listed. Renovated in 1990s – previously 3 cottages nos 44, 46 (oldest) and 48. Inscription AC1666 on lintel. Dovecote. Diaper brickwork. Had large gardens and orchard to rear now Cottage Gardens Close. Well and underground reservoir.

**Listed building.** 1984.

House; ?AC 1666? on window frame. Stone plinth, red brick, plain tile roofs. T-plan with ?Vertical? parallel to street. Two storeys, 2 windows in range parallel to street. Regularly spaced but mixed fenestration. Gable end to street has 2-light leaded window (with date carved above) to ground floor and 3-light unglazed moulded timber opening in plinth. Rear has been rebuilt.
