



This Indenture Witnesseth

that *William Percu Henson*
the son of *Edith Ellen Hunt (formerly Mrs Henson)*
The Green, Hathern in the County of Leicester
(with the consent of his *mother*) doth put himself
Apprentice to THE HATHERN STATION BRICK & TERRA COTTA
COMPANY LIMITED whose registered office is situate at Hathern
Station Works in the County of Nottingham Terra Cotta Manu-
facturers (hereinafter called "the said Company") to learn the art
of a Plaster Model Maker and with the said Company after the
manner of an apprentice to serve from the *Twenty-fifth day of*
June One thousand nine hundred and *Twenty-nine*
at any place in the United Kingdom where the said Company may
be carrying out any work and may require his services until the
Twenty-first day of April One thousand nine hundred
and *Thirty-Four* During which term the said Apprentice
the said Company faithfully shall serve their secrets keep their
lawful commands everywhere gladly do he shall do no damage to
the said Company nor see to be done of others but to his power shall
tell or forthwith give warning to the said Company of the same he
shall not waste the goods of the said Company nor lend them unlaw-
fully to any he shall not contract matrimony within the said term
nor play at cards or dice tables or any other unlawful games whereby
the said Company may have any loss with their own goods or others
during the said term without the license of the said Company he
shall neither buy nor sell he shall not haunt taverns or playhouses
nor absent himself from the said Company's service day or night
unlawfully But in all things as a faithful Apprentice he shall
behave himself towards the said Company and all theirs during the
said term AND in particular he shall (when the session is on) attend
regularly technical classes for instruction in the work which he is
being taught under this Indenture and/or in such other subjects
as may be required by the said Company AND the said Company
in consideration of such service and of the covenants on the part
of the said *Edith Ellen Hunt*
hereinafter contained hereby covenants with the said
Edith Ellen Hunt and with the said

Apprentice to provide the said Apprentice with tools to the total value of *Two Pounds* and to pay the said Apprentice on the usual pay day in each week the following wage namely:—

from *25th June* 1929 to *21st April* 1930

an amount equal to *one-third* ~~per cent.~~

from *22nd April* 1930 to *21st April* 1931

an amount equal to *five-twelfths* ~~per cent.~~

from *22nd April* 1931 to *21st April* 1932

an amount equal to *one-half* ~~per cent.~~

from *22nd April* 1932 to *21st April* 1933

an amount equal to *seven-twelfths* ~~per cent.~~

from *22nd April* 1933 to *21st April* 1934

an amount equal to *two-thirds* ~~per cent.~~

of the standard weekly wage for the time being paid to a journeyman worker in plaster model-making.

AND FURTHER that the said Company their said Apprentice in the Art of a Plaster Model Maker which they use by the best means that they can shall teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed AND the said *Edith Ellen Hunt* hereby covenants with the Company that he will provide the said Apprentice with sufficient meat drink clothing lodging medicine medical attendance and all other necessaries during the said term AND IT IS HEREBY AGREED that the working hours of the said Apprentice shall be the same as the working hours of a journeyman worker in plaster model-making and if in any week the said Apprentice shall work more than such number of hours he shall be paid for such overtime a sum per hour to be ascertained by dividing the weekly wage to which the Apprentice is then entitled under this Indenture by *the number of hours constituting the working week* PROVIDED ALWAYS AND IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that the Company shall be at liberty to deduct from time to time out of the wages to be paid to the said Apprentice as aforesaid any sum or sums of money which may be reasonable for any loss of time occasioned by the absence through sickness or other incapacity to work of the said Apprentice and also for any loss which the said Company may sustain by reason of the negligence or misconduct of the said Apprentice PROVIDED FURTHER AND IT IS HEREBY

AGREED that in case the said Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to the lawful and reasonable commands of the said Company or shall otherwise grossly misconduct himself it shall be lawful for the said Company to discharge the said Apprentice from their said service AND for the due performance of all and every the said covenants and agreements either of the said parties bindeth himself unto the other by these presents.

IN WITNESS whereof the said *William Percy Henson* and *Edith Ellen Hunt* have hereunto set their hands and seals and the Common Seal of the said Company has been hereunto affixed the *27th* day of *June*.
